

## Parent Update 3.22.20

Dixie Families,

We hope that all of our Dixie families are well and adjusting to measures put in place to slow the spread of COVID-19. We greatly appreciate the support we have received from Dixie parents and the flexibility of so many as we create a learning foundation for students through technology.

As we press on with education during Ohio the school closure, we plan to provide families with updated information and resources on a regular basis.

We are entering week 2 of electronic lessons and schoolwork. Please remember to check email often for class and school information. Keeping up with the completion of school work is very important during the closure so that it will be less taxing on students when we resume.

For technology and learning help, please call the main office of each school. The secretary will direct your call to someone who will help. Remember, the Dixie parking lots and the parking lots of a number of churches and businesses have WIFI access for guests.

To make lunch more accessible for children, we have changed our lunch program to provide 5 meals a week at one time and for children from 2 to 18 living in the New Lebanon District as well as all students enrolled at Dixie who live outside the district. We are also able to make meal deliveries. To reserve lunches for the week of March 30th, please call your school office starting Thursday morning and before Friday at noon--this reservation period allows us to prepare the meals for Monday. If you leave a message please be sure to give the number of children from 2 to 18, their names, whether you need pick up or delivery and your address. We prefer that meals be picked up if possible.

Pick up will be from 11 am to 12 pm at each school. Deliveries will be made from 11 am to 1 pm. Remember, to reduce contact, do not meet the delivery person. Please allow them to leave the meals on your doorstep. Be sure to collect the meals promptly as some items will need refrigeration.

Thank you for all that you have done and for continuing to make the best of a very difficult situation.
